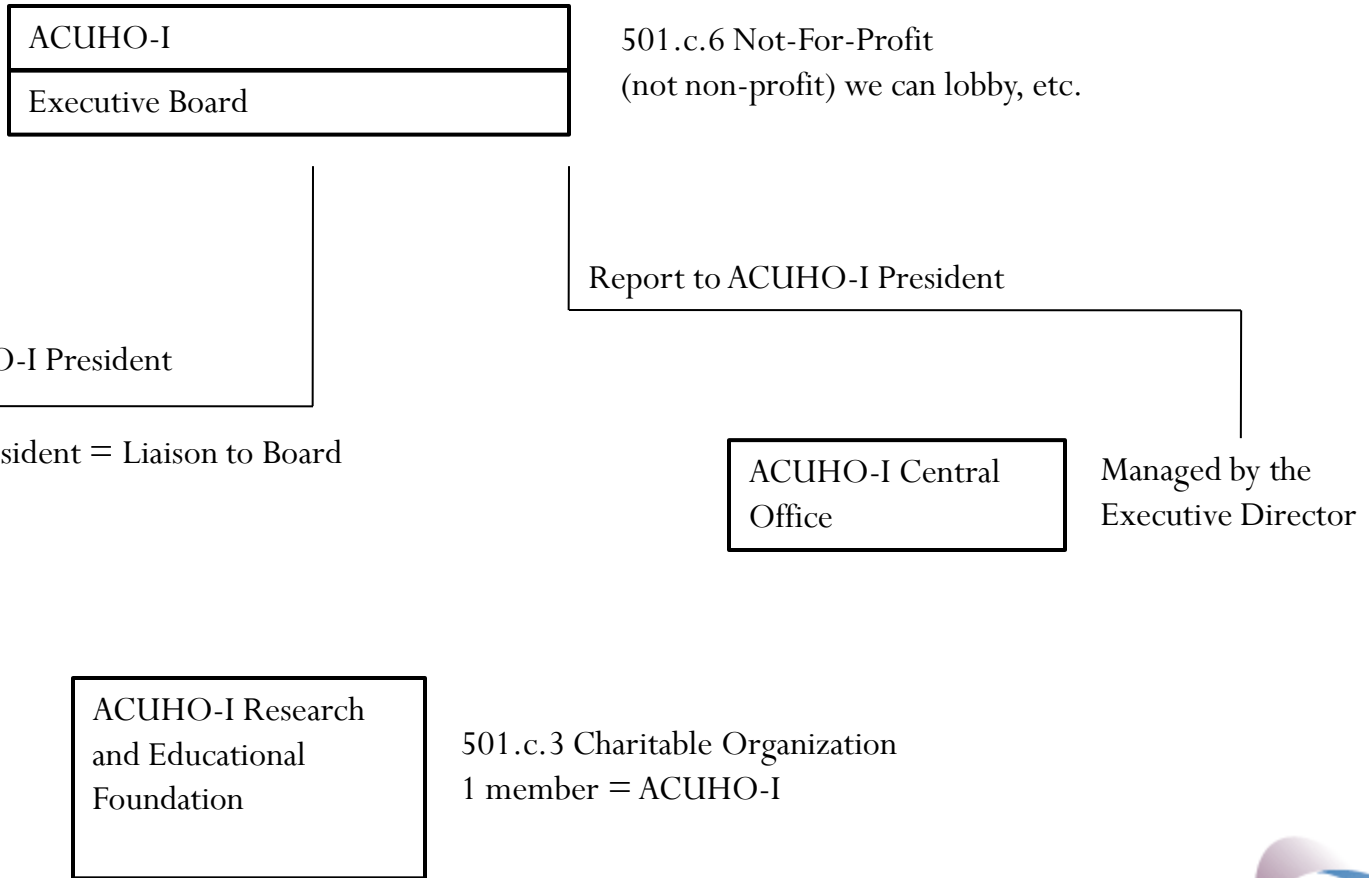

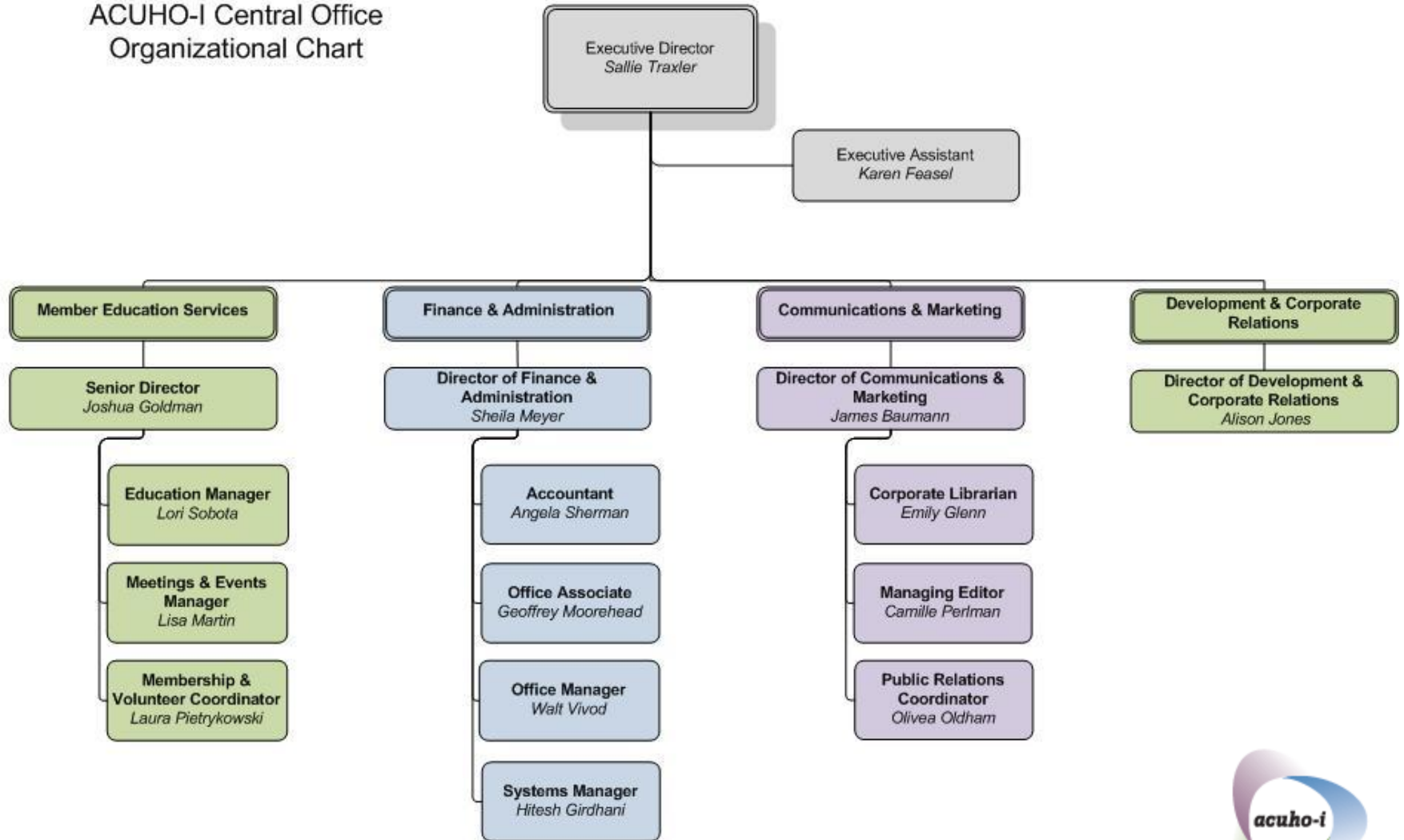

Central Office Information

- A. The Executive Director is responsible for supervision of the central office.
- B. The central office is divided into 4 major units with each unit being headed by a Director.
- C. The four units in the central office are: Member Education Services, Finance and Administration, Communications and Marketing, Development and Corporate Relations.
- D. Each ACUHO-I working group has a central office staff member who serves as their liaison.
- E. Executive Board Members who need to request projects or information from the central office staff should first submit their request to the Executive Director and ACUHO-I President.

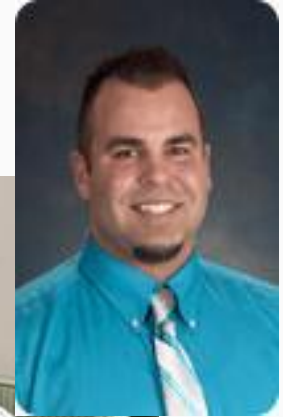

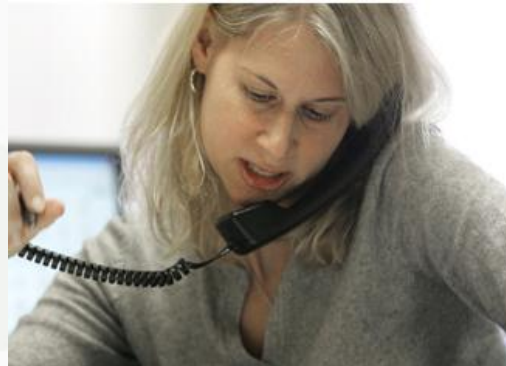

The ACUHO-I Executive Board

- A. The Executive Board is comprised of 13 elected positions and the Executive Director (Ex-officio).
- B. There are two parts to the board. The Executive Committee and the Board of Directors.
- C. The Executive Committee is made up of the President, President- Elect, Vice-President and Finance and Corporate Records Office.
- D. The Executive Committee is responsible for planning for the Executive Board and its work
- E. The Board of Directors is comprised of the 9 Directors positions.
- F. The President, with approval of the board, has the discretion to appoint two additional non-voting board members to the board.

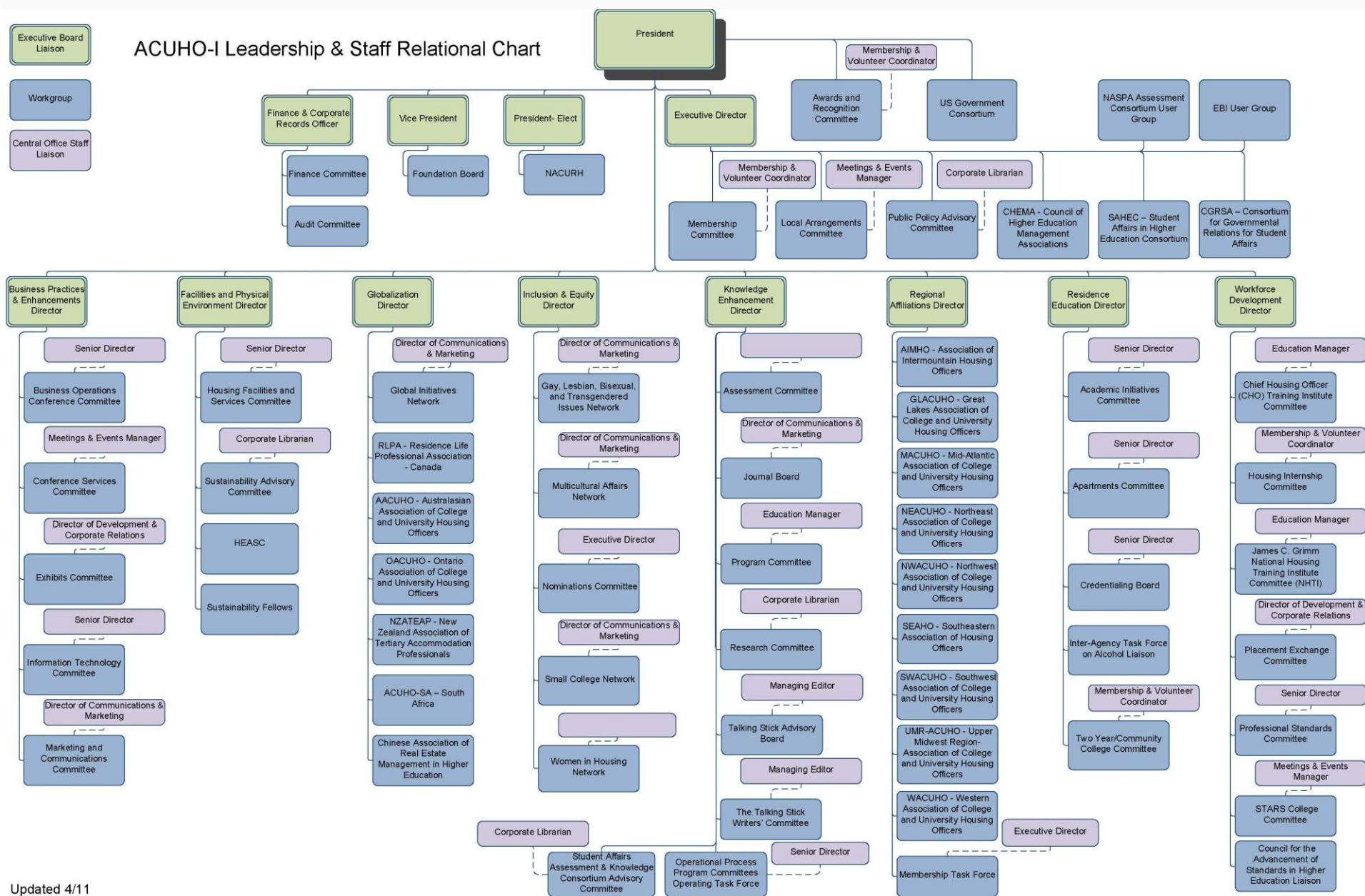

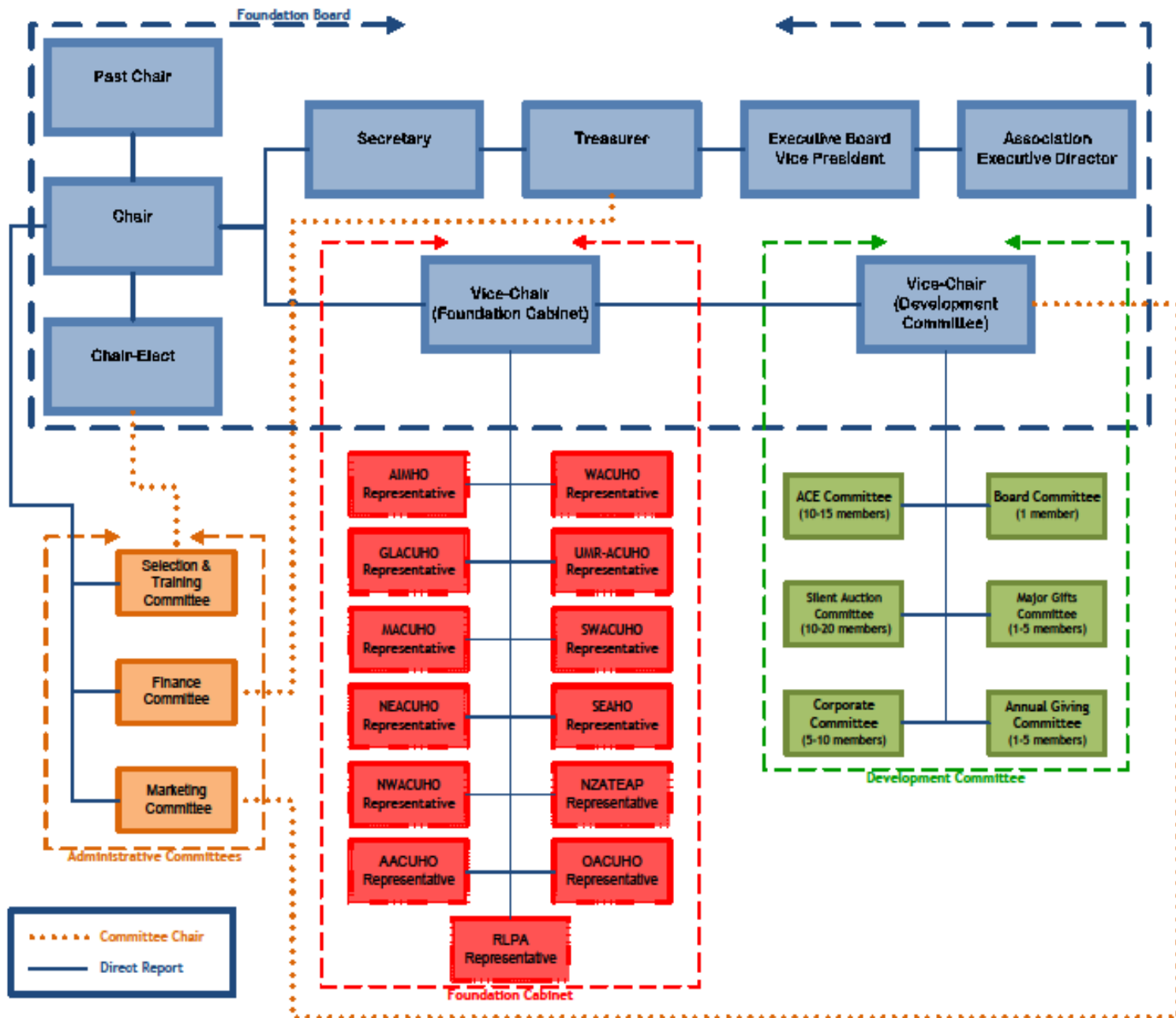

Regional Associations and ACUHO-I

- All affiliated regional associations are independent organizations – no direct legal connection between them or ACUHO-I (individual incorporation, separate finances, etc.)
- However, due to shared mission and goals, legal counsel expert with nonprofit associations has advised that there is an implicit relationship between the organizations – has implications for liability
- ACUHO-I facilitates an opportunity for the regions to meet at ACE prior to the conference, but the regions develop the agenda
- Regional receptions at ACE are the responsibility of the regions – ACUHO-I arranges for space but does not fund the receptions
- While each of us is a member of a regional association, our role on the Board, or as a work group chair requires, us to make ACUHO-I related decisions based on the best interests of the international organization, not the regional one
