



ACUHO-I Campus Home. Live! – Inclusive Presenters’ Guide

Purpose:

The purpose of the Inclusive Presenters’ Guide is to share strategies presenters can infuse into their presentations to incorporate accessibility and inclusion into the entirety of ACUHO-I Campus Home. Live! program sessions.

Facilitation Strategies:

- 1) Introduce yourself and how you wish to be referred to during the session.
- 2) Before asking a question or making a comment, ask audience members to introduce themselves and how they wish to be referred to as well as their home institution.
- 3) Consider beginning with a land acknowledgement from your campus and your own reflections on the land acknowledgement. Share why this is important to you as a person and/or your campus community. See example in the [Presenter Resources page](#) of the Campus Home.LIVE! webpage.
- 4) When sharing information/research, acknowledge any limitations in your data or operations.
- 5) Utilize the microphone(s) in the session room to provide the opportunity for attendees to clearly hear the information being presented.
- 6) When audience members ask questions, repeat the questions back to the audience utilizing the microphone provided or give audience members the opportunity to use the microphone to ask their questions.
- 7) Identify ways to effectively engage participants and allow time for participants to process the information included in your presentation.
 - a) Engage participants through multiple methods: auditory, visual, verbal, logical, physical, social, and solitary. Share what you have written on your slides and describe the images on each slide.
 - b) Provide handouts in both digital and hard copy formats.
 - c) Utilize multiple engagement methods throughout the presentation.
- 8) Practice utilizing your technology and captioning.
- 9) Consider room space and the kinds of movement attendees will be participating in throughout the presentation (moving chairs for small group discussions for example).

Slides and Content:

- 1) Include captions on any videos and images in your presentation.
 - a) **Enable real time, automatic live captions during your session.**
 - b) Add alternative text to images so that screen readers can convey to users what is in the image.
 - c) Tip: To add alt-text in PowerPoint, right-click the image, choose Format Picture, and click on “Alt Text” or right-click the image and choose “Edit Alt Text”. See more information here: [9 Ways to Make Your Presentation Accessible](#).
 - i) Be specific with alt-text so a screen reader can convey the information to the user.

- ii) When presenting or referring to pictures, diagrams, and tables, be sure to also describe them verbally
- 2) Limit the amount of text on slides when possible and utilize an easy-to-read font size.
 - a) Tip: PowerPoint has a range of themes that will create easier-to-read slides, including large text boxes and large content areas.
 - b) Font size of 24+ is encouraged.
- 3) Choose color palettes that are ideal for those who have visual accessibility needs.
 - a) Consider colors and color contrast when creating your presentation.

- 4) Spell out acronyms on slides and share what acronyms mean in your presentation.
- 5) Have a plan for technology failure.
 - a) Tip: Utilize a QR code that participants can scan to look at your presentation on their own device. You may also want to print a few copies of your presentation for yourself and attendees who may not have access to viewing your presentation online in the case of a technology challenge.
